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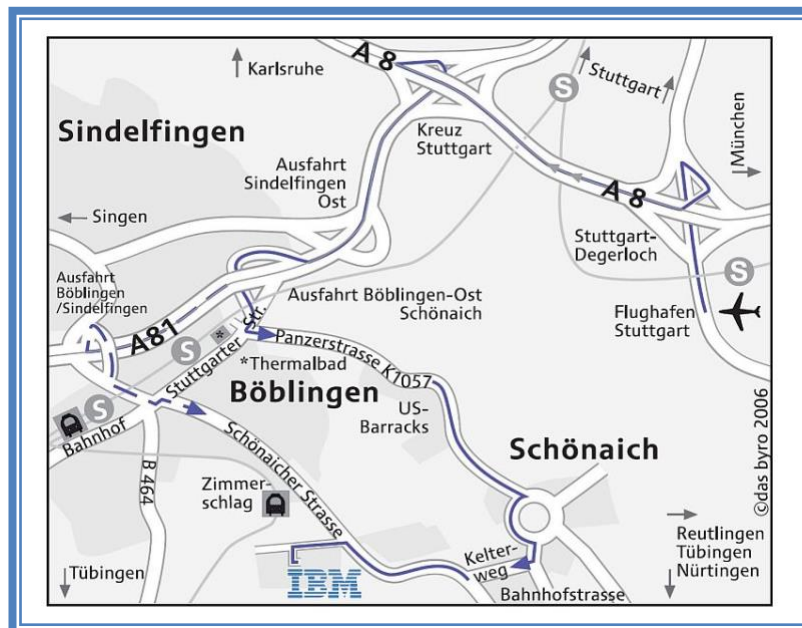

Directions

By plane

[Stuttgart Airport](#) is the nearest international airport.

From the airport you have various possibilities to get to IBM Germany Research & Development, Boeblingen:

- A taxi ride takes approximately 35 minutes to IBM (about 35,- € one way)
- [Rental car](#):
 - Follow the A8 direction Karlsruhe
 - Turn right into the A81 direction Singen at the motorway junction Stuttgart
 - From there carry on as explained below
- [Public transportation](#):
 - Take subway S2 or S3 direction Stuttgart Main Station (both lines are leaving from platform 2)
 - Exit at 'Stuttgart Rohr' and change to subway S1 direction Herrenberg
 - Exit at 'Boeblingen Bahnhof'
 - From there carry on as explained below

By train or bus

Boeblingen Bahnhof is the nearest train station.

From Boeblingen Bahnhof you have various possibilities to get to IBM Germany Research & Development, Boeblingen:

- A taxi ride takes approximately 10 minutes to IBM (about 15,- € one way)
- Public transportation:
 - Bus No. 760 direction Waldenbuch/Weil i. S., exit at bus stop 'Abzweig Rauher Kapf' (The bus stop is next to IBM.)
 - Bus No. 709 direction Rauher Kapf, exit at bus stop 'Taunusstraße' (IBM is located at the opposite side of the road.)
 - Schönbuchbahn (departure from track 1 in Boeblingen) and exit at the stop 'Zimmerschlag'. From there it is a 10 minute walk to IBM (see map on the front page).

[Local public transportation \(VVS\)](#) [German Rail \(Deutsche Bahn\)](#)

By car coming from Stuttgart or the airport

- Motorway A81 direction Singen/Herrenberg
- Take exit 22 Boeblingen-Ost toward Schoenaich
- At first traffic light turn left onto K1055 Schoenaich/Nuertingen
- Continue on K1057/Panzerstraße
- After 4 km you reach a roundabout, take the 1st exit onto 'Im Vogelsang', Schoenaich. Take care: speed limit 30 km/h!
- Continue onto Bahnhofstrasse
- Turn right at Kelterweg (second street)
- Drive until the end and turn right onto 'Schoenaicher Strasse' (direction Boeblingen)
- After 1 km turn left at the traffic light and you are entering the IBM premises

By car coming from Herrenberg

- On the motorway A81 take the exit 23 Boeblingen/ Sindelfingen toward Boeblingen
- Merge into L1185/ Rudolf-Diesel-Strasse
- Drive through Boeblingen direction Schoenaich/ Nuertingen (1,5 km)
- Slight left at L1185/ Poststrasse
- Turn right at Klaffensteinstrasse/ L1185 and continue to follow L1185 (2,8 km)
- After you have crossed the railway tracks outside of Boeblingen turn right and follow the signs to IBM

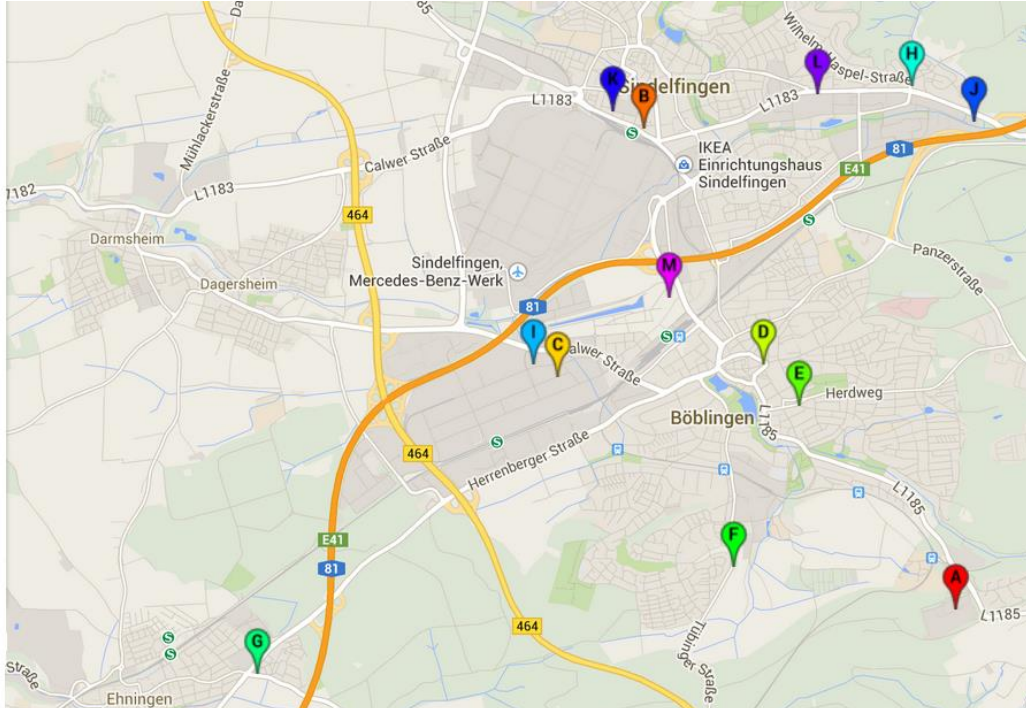

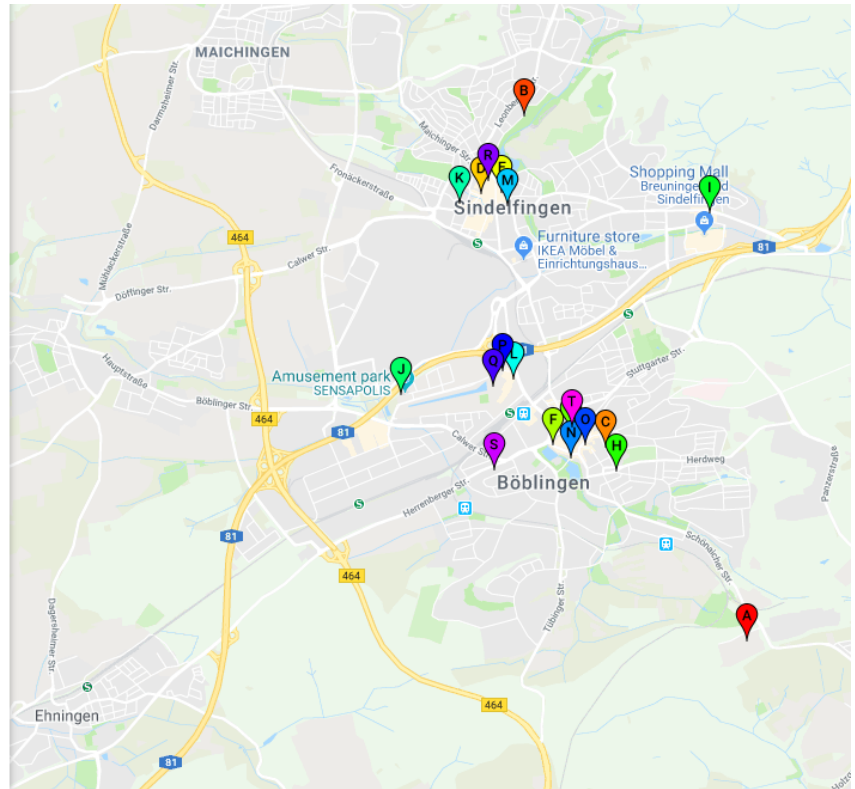

Places of interest

Places of interest in and around [Boeblingen](#)

[Upper and lower lake:](#) The two lakes are located in the center of Boeblingen and are a good place to spend some quality time. They are surrounded by some good restaurants and bars, with superb views in both, summer and winter.

[Schoenbuch Braeu brewery:](#) To see Schoenbuch Braeu from behind the scenes is well worth it. There, the beer is still brewed in a manageable quantity and what counts above all is quality, craftsmanship and good taste. After the tour, while sitting in their large beer garden or their beer hall, one can savor their traditional, locally produced German beer.

[Mineraltherme Boeblingen:](#) With its natural mineral water, the extremely many-sided relaxation- and health programs as well as the generously formed recreation areas, the thermal spa "Mineraltherme Boeblingen" allows you to have heavenly moments.

[Sensapolis:](#) Indoor leisure-park with high wire climbing area and electric go-kart track etc.

[Motorworld \(formerly known as Meilenwerk\):](#) This is a meeting place for vintage car enthusiasts. The whole spectrum of classic, stylish and exclusive vehicles including suitable retailers, restorers and restaurants can be found under one roof.

[Ritter Sport:](#) This famous German chocolate factory is located in Waldenbuch, south-east of Boeblingen. Accompanying the factory is a visitors' center in which one can explore the history of chocolate and of the factory. Of course, one can taste and buy all chocolaty creations of Ritter Sport. Besides, a collection of art and varying exhibitions can be enjoyed in the nearby [Museum Ritter](#).

Places of interest in and around [Tuebingen](#)

[Schloss Hohentuebingen:](#) The present castle, in which samples of the historical collection of the university are displayed, mostly dates back to the 16th century. It is possible to visit some of the original castle rooms. From the castle one can enjoy amazing views across the city.

[Medieval marketplace:](#) The medieval marketplace is located in the old section of the city which is well worth a stroll around. Every Monday, Wednesday and Friday the local farmers come together and sell their goods in the same way they have done for centuries.

[The Neckar Island and Plane Tree Avenue:](#) This little, picturesque island is a perfect place for relaxing, taking a stroll, jogging or even playing boule. From there, visitors can enjoy the impressive view towards the Tuebingen Neckar Riverfront.

[Punting boat trip:](#) One can sit on a punting boat while floating down the Neckar River. This is very romantic.

[Neckarmueller:](#) After punting or sightseeing you might wish to reward yourself with a refreshing beverage in the nearby beer garden „Neckarmueller“. This is a popular microbrewery with its beer garden overlooking the Neckar River.

[Car- and toymuseum "Boxenstop":](#) Big cars, small cars, old-timers, racers and sports cars, racing motorcycles, child pedal cars – all those curiosities make the hearts of car and motorcycle lovers leap with joy at the Boxenstop. Furthermore, an extensive toy-collection comprises more than 1000 valuable vintage toys like miniature steam railroads, model airplanes, dolls, games and much more.

[Kloster Bebenhausen:](#) This medieval monastery is located within the Schönbuch nature reserve between Tuebingen and Boeblingen. The village, which belongs to the monastery, is still surrounded by a medieval wall which is still almost completely intact.

[Schloss Hohenentrigen:](#) Likewise, located in the south-western corner of the Schönbuch nature reserve, this small castle which is surrounded by forest and prominently placed on a ledge can be explored. Within the old castlewalls one can encounter an unusual restaurant. Schloss Hohenentrigen can be reached by car or by going for a nice hike.

[Burg Hohenzollern:](#) This is a picture-perfect castle and probably one of the nicest we have in Europe. This awe-inspiring castle offers a stunning panoramic view across the Swabian Alb and is the ancestral seat of the Prussian Royal House and of the Hohenzollern Princes.

[Schloss Lichtenstein:](#) This is a smaller, but very authentic, old castle. At that place, the original castle was constructed in 1390 AD, however, its appearance was altered repeatedly during history.

[Outletcity Metzingen:](#) Here, one can experience shopping at its best! In more than 60 flagship outlet stores international premium brand producers offer discounts of up to 70% on their goods.

[Mercedes-Benz Museum:](#) A big attraction for visitors to Stuttgart is the sensational Mercedes-Benz Museum. On a total area of approximately 17.000 sqm, roughly 160 vehicles and over 1,500 exhibits can be admired on permanent display. There, one cannot only marvel at the first car ever constructed but also glance at lately produced vehicles or future technologies. Besides, historical background information of the various epochs is provided.

[Porsche Museum:](#) In January 2009, Porsche AG opened up a new, futuristically designed museum next to its headquarters. There, about 80 vehicles and numerous small exhibits are presented. Must-sees are 'Porsche classics' like the 356, the 550, the 911 or the 917. Most of the exhibits are still roadworthy and licensed to be driven on public roads.

[Staatsgalerie \(State Gallery\):](#) The State Gallery of Stuttgart, built in the years 1838 - 1843 under King Wilhelm I of Wuerttemberg, has been one of the most visited German museums. The classicist building from the 19th century, the Old State Gallery, is home to the works from the 14th to the 19th century. The New State Gallery, is dedicated to the art of the 20th century. Free entry on Wednesdays.

[Kunstmuseum Stuttgart \(Art Museum Stuttgart\):](#) This art museum, which opened in 2005, already entices visitors from afar. Especially at night, when the transparent outer shell of glass is brilliantly illuminated and the cube of stone in the building's core grows visible from the outside. Although the outer appearance of the building makes visitors anticipate a clear-cut architectural structure, upon entering they are surprised when confronted by two former traffic tunnels. These provide the greatest part by far of the 5,000 square-meter exhibition space where great pieces of contemporary art are displayed.

[Schlossplatz \(Palace Square\):](#) The writer Hacklaender transformed the formerly dusty parade ground into a flower garden in the 1860s. Nowadays, it is the vibrant heart of the city. The Jubilee Column at its center was erected in honor of King Wilhelm I's silver jubilee in the year 1841. The square is surrounded by the **New Castle**, which currently houses the ministries of the Baden-Wuerttemberg state government, the **Old Castle**, which houses the **regional museum of Baden-Wuerttemberg** and the Art-Museum Stuttgart.

[Wilhelma:](#) This zoological-botanical garden was built from 1842 - 1853 for King Wilhelm I of Wuerttemberg as a Moorish garden. With around 9,000 animals of almost 1,000 species, Wilhelma is a well-known spot to see for visitors of all ages. Besides an ape-house or an aquarium with a crocodile hall and a famous coral fish collection one can marvel at an impressive collection of orchids. During spring one should not miss out on the bloom of numerous magnolias.

[Grabkapelle auf dem Wuerttemberg:](#) This sepulchral chapel was erected between 1820 and 1824 by King Wilhelm I in memory of his beloved wife Katharina, who died at a young age. As it is prominently located on the top of a hill and surrounded by vineyards, one can enjoy magnificent views across the Neckar River valley and Stuttgart.

[Esslingen:](#) Nestled in the Neckar River valley and surrounded by vineyards one can find Esslingen, a romantic city which looks back on a history of over 700 years. The **Esslinger Burg** – once a part of the old city walls – has overseen the glory of the whole well preserved medieval **Old Town**, which enchants visitors immediately with its winding cobblestone alleyways. During December a famous **medieval Christmas market** takes place in the Old Town. In Esslingen one can also savor a glass of local sparkling wine from **Kessler Sekt**, Germany's oldest producer of sparkling wine. There, guided tours on the premises are available.

[Ludwigsburg:](#) This city is very famous for its three baroque palaces. The biggest and best-known of them is the **Residenzschloss (Residential Palace)** in the middle of the town. During summer, this palace is surrounded by the garden show **blooming baroque**. A two-kilometer long, bolt upright ally connects the Residenzschloss with the hunting lodge and summer residence **Favorite** and the **Monrepos** lakeside palace. Atypical for German cities is the rectangular alignment of streets in the city center of Ludwigsburg.

[Kloster Maulbronn:](#) This monastery is one of Europe's most complete and best preserved medieval monastery complexes. It combines a multitude of architectural styles, from Romanesque to late Gothic in one place – creating a unique atmosphere. Therefore, the monastery was declared a UNESCO World Heritage site in 1993.
